On the evening of Thursday, August 8, Bishop Luis Zarama celebrated a Mass of Candidacy at St. Peter Catholic Church in Greenville. This special Mass marked a significant step for Keegan Moloney, a seminarian at St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary, as he publicly declared his intention to receive Holy Orders. Bishop Luis, in his homily, highlighted how God's work is often revealed in unexpected ways, a theme that resonated with the changes surrounding this year's Mass. He expressed joy at being surrounded by the parish community, who had come together to support Keegan. The bishop's words underscored the importance of communal involvement in the formation of seminarians, emphasizing that the journey to priesthood is one walked not just by the individual but by the entire Church. Monsignor Ingham, a beloved priest of the Diocese of Raleigh for 49 years, passed away peacefully after a courageous battle with cancer. He spent his final days surrounded by friends and his brother priests, united in prayer. 


A Legacy of Faith and Service
