

HOME MISSION SOCIETY

North Carolina's increasing Catholic population has created a need to build new churches and expand existing parishes to serve the faithful. Many locations in eastern North Carolina are home to immigrant and working-class Catholics who are currently unable to fully fund construction of structures that can accommodate their growing population.

The Home Mission Society is a grant program that was created to assist small parishes with construction and furnishing of rural churches in the Diocese of Raleigh. For many decades, the Diocese depended on the Catholic Extension Society and other outside sources to provide grants to assist in building churches in mission or rural areas. Today, the Catholic Extension Society no longer provides funding due to our growth.

In 2007, Bishop Michael F. Burbidge established the Home Mission Society with the purpose of partially funding construction and furnishing of churches in remote and underserved areas in eastern North Carolina.

Since its inception, the Home Mission Society provided grants to four churches for new construction: St. Mary of the Angels (Mount Olive), San Isidro (Fayetteville), Our Lady of the Rosary (Louisburg), and St. Joseph the Worker (Warrenton). These grants have allowed these parishes to serve and nourish the catholic community.

Frequently these parishes show their gratitude by making donations to the Home Mission Society, so other parishes can benefit from the generosity shown to them.

A donation to the Home Mission Society supports the Gospel mandate to proclaim the Good News to all ends of the Earth.



On Tuesday October 25, The Foundation hosted the 10th annual <u>Fr. Thomas F. Price</u> <u>Catholic Heritage Society</u> Mass & Luncheon. Bishop Zarama celebrated Mass and after was joined by approximately 40 members for lunch, where they heard a little of Fr. Price's North Carolina story from guest speaker Father Chris Koehn.
